Use of Results

The results of the Program Goals and Student Learning Outcomes for Academic Year 2020-21 were reviewed by The Rinker School Director Dr. Robert Cox and FES Program Director Dr. Jeffrey Lindsey. In the Fall of 2017 the program transitioned into the University of Florida Online College (UFO) delivery and were able to evaluate the program more effectively based on improved data availability.

The BSFES program had a 60% increase in students due to a successful year of growth from 255 students to 294 students. During 2020-2021 we surpassed the 100 student and 200 course enrollment goals for the program.

The number of enrolled students was:

Summer 2020 154 students enrolled in 522 course enrollments.
Fall 2020 223 students enrolled in 673 course enrollments.
Spring 2021 198 students enrolled in 648 course enrollments.

The program had a goal of a one-semester completion rate of 90 % and this was met each term with an average of 97% one semester course completion for the 2020-2021 year.

The target of graduates for the year was 30 and the FES program conferred 50 degrees over the 2020-2021 academic year.

Due to the restrictions on travel during the COVID 19 pandemic, we saw a noticeable decrease in our recruiting efforts, which we have addressed by increasing the number of Fire Station visits for direct recruiting. We have also increased our attendance at state and national conferences - Fire Rescue East, EMS Today, Hurricane Conference both state and national, FDIC, Fire Rescue International, EMS World and IAEM that are opening again in 2022. As a result, over the past years, the program has hired a second fulltime faculty member to improve course quality and has hired a third fulltime faculty member who will assist with advising the graduate program.
