Use of Results

The results of the Program Goals and Student Learning Outcomes for Academic Year 2021-22 were reviewed by The Rinker School Director Dr. Robert Cox and FES Program Director Dr. Jeffrey Lindsey.

The MSFES program had a goal of 16 enrolled students each semester, during the 2021-2022 Academic Year the MSFES program enrolled 22 students for Summer 2021, 49 students for Fall 2021, and 62 students for Spring 2022.

The program had a goal of a one semester completion rate of 90 % and this was met each term with an average of 100% one semester course completion for the 2021-2022 Academic Year.

The target of graduates for the year was 8 students and the FES program conferred 13 Master's The target of graduates for the year was 8 students and the FES program conferred 8 Master's degrees over the 2021-2022 Academic Year. With the increase in student admissions and students enrolling Part Time in the program we expect the number of graduates to increase next year.

A new Instructor/Graduate Advisor was hired and determined that the evaluative methods are effective. Going forward we will review the course assignments to see if changes need to be made.
