Combined Degree (Bachelor's + MURP) Program



The Urban and Regional Planning combined degree program allows academically qualified students to earn a Bachelor's degree and a Master of Urban and Regional Planning (MURP) in 5 years.

Next Steps for Interested Students

Qualified students have a minimum GPA of 3.2.

Interested students should meet with their undergraduate academic advisor to determine their eligibility.

Interested students should also meet with Kyle Dost, Interim 4+1 Coordinator, URP Graduate Coordinator, to prepare a plan of study and complete a combined degree contract.

Program Requirements

The MURP Combined Degree Program allows undergraduate students to earn up-to 21 graduate credits while pursuing their undergraduate degree.

These credits count toward the student's undergraduate degree.

Upon successful completion of graduate URP credits (B grade or better), and admission to the MURP degree program, these credits transfer into the student's graduate program.
