**\*\*COURSE DESCRIPTION:** This course provides an overview of the application of management principles to the provision of transport services. Includes an analysis of the economic, geographic, temporal, and clinical characteristics of ambulance demand, the

key processes for providing transport services, and an evaluation of industry best practices.

**\*\*PREREQUISITE KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS:** None

**PURPOSE OF COURSE:** This course provides an overview of the application of management principles to the provision of transport services.

**COURSE GOALS AND/OR OBJECTIVES:** By the end of this course, students will:

1. Describe and analyze the economic characteristics of ambulance markets.

2. Describe the geographic and temporal characteristics of demand for transport services.

Evaluate the research on the clinical characteristics of EMS patients.
Describe the key processes for providing transport services including techniques for producing quality efficiently and effectively.
Evaluate the techniques for deploying and managing EMS resources to

produce reliable and efficient response time performance.

6. Describe the best practices for the management of transport services.

\*\* HOW THIS COURSE RELATES TO THE STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES IN THE FIRE EMERGENCY SERVICES PROGRAM: Identify and evaluate organizational problems associated with fire and emergency services. Illustrate knowledge and legal application of safety, health and environmental regulations at state and federal levels. Properly address issues of management, code regulations and the labor market in fire and emergency services.

**\*\*TEACHING PHILOSOPHY:** I am looking for students to demonstrate a working knowledge of the subject. You need to be creative when you complete your assignments but maintain a professional appearance of your work. Your work needs to be complete and in such a manner that someone can pick up your document and understand what you are trying to convey. And most of all your work needs to be supported with research and cited in properly in APA format.

**\*\*INSTRUCTIONAL METHODS:** The course is designed for individual and group interactivity. It is important to post and respond to discussion questions in the course

within the time frame allotted. This provides a learning environment by networking with other students in the course. The assignments are individual base to give you the opportunity to do a variety of activities, in many cases, similar to what you will be doing in role as a leader in the emergency services profession.
